

Let's Go Fishing!

To be good at fishing you need a fishing stick and . . . fish!
Small fish, medium fish and big fish! Have a great time fishing!
It's easy and lots of fun!

Materials needed

Fish

- Blunt nose scissors
- Glue
- Stapler
- Felt markers

Fishing stick

- Thin string (30 cm)
- Wood stick
- Small magnets

Sea

- Small cardboard box (roughly 15 cm thick)

Fish baskets

- Fish baskets (baskets, bowls, etc.)

Instructions

Fish

1. Colour the fish.
2. Cut out the fish.
3. Staple two staples in the centre of each fish. The staples will adhere to the magnet in the fishing stick.

Fishing stick

1. Attach the magnet to the line.
2. Tie the other end of the line to the end of the stick.
3. Dab a bit of glue to fasten the line more firmly to the stick.

Note

You'll find 4 fish patterns (small, medium and big) on each page of the pattern (2 pages).



Instructions

Sea

1. Cut off the edges of the cardboard box to facilitate fishing.
2. Cover the box with blue paper or cardboard.
3. Draw and colour fish, shells, algae, etc. on each side of the box.

The game

1. Put out the fish baskets.
2. Put all the fish in the box representing the sea.
3. Begin fishing, explaining that fish are caught when the magnet on the fishing stick attracts the staples in the fish. Then explain that the fish must be placed in a container of corresponding size (small, medium and big).
4. Finish by looking at the fish that have already been caught.
5. Ask the child if the fish have been placed in the right container.

Note

Your child can find this activity later by clicking the leaf in Rabbit's nutshell backpack.
